

Audax Australia Brevet Raid Rules

1. The Audax Australia Ride Rules, as amended from time to time, apply to Brevet Raid events (Raids) subject to the variations set out in these rules.
2. To enter a Raid a rider must forward a correctly filled in entry form and correct payment to the Raid Secretary.
3. Routes are defined for each Raid. Riders who leave the route to detour around hazardous road conditions or because of environmental conditions (such as flood or fire), must return to the route as soon as practicable.
4. Riding is only allowable in daylight hours as defined by the times of local sunrise and sunset.
5. Some Raids, for safety reasons, have open seasons. These Raids can only be ridden within their open season.
6. Each Raid has a specific time limit. The time limits for road Raids are worked out on an average of 80 km / day and for off-road raids on an average of 40 km / day.
7. Intermediate controls do not have time limits. Rest days within the total time limits are allowed.
8. Riders must carry their brevet card at all times and have it stamped or signed at the controls specified in the route notes.
9. Riders may receive support (for example from a vehicle or resident) during a ride, but cannot be transported along the route.
10. Audax Australia's decision is final in determining successful completion of a Raid.
11. To have the successful completion of a Raid recognised, the completed brevet card must be returned to the Raid Secretary within 7 days of the completion date.
